

EDITORIAL

AGENDA 2024 - SO FAR, SO VERY GOOD

"A leader is one who knows the way, goes the way and shows the way." - John C. Maxwell.

n the year 2021, His Excellency the President of the Republic and Commander-in-Chief of the Ghana Armed Forces appointed Rear Admiral Issah Adam Yakubu as the Chief of the Naval Staff (CNS). To say Admral IA Yakubu came on board already prepared is an understatement. This is a seasoned senior naval officer who has held strategic appointments within the Ghana Navy - both afloat and ashore.

It was therefore not surprising when within a short period of assuming office, he came out with his vision for the Navy. It is said that a true leader should have the power to begin, the eloquence to communicate, the patience to execute and above all, the wisdom to evaluate. In a nutshell, this means carrying the team along - letting them believe in your vision and leading them to achieve success.

Agenda 2024 sought to examine where the Ghana Navy stood, and where it ought to be by December 2024. This editorial therefore seeks to assess the journey so far, with barely some nine months left on the calendar.

One of the strategic objective was to achieve total surveillance coverage of **NAVAL CAPTAIN ANDY LA-ANYANE**

our Exclusive Economic Zone. Since 2021, under the leadership of Admiral Yakubu, the Ghana Navy has added monitoring systems to the ones that existed, enhancing the maritime domain awareness capabilities of the Navy.

When he took over the reins of the Navy, no new major ship had been commissioned into the fleet for ten years. Through the support of government and his innovative ways, four 40-metre Offshore Security Vessels (River Class) were acquired which are currently providing security to the national oil infrastructure at sea. In all, six ships have

so far been commissioned into the fleet since 2021. More are at different stages of acquisition.

The welfare of the sailors in areas of education, accommodation, promotions, training and many others have been enhanced. Whilst the Senior Rates have been provided with a modern 61-unit transit quarters and a mess, most of the specialist courses have been affiliated to the Takoradi and Ho Technical Universities for accreditation

Additionally, the Navy has acquired a new Lodge and a 4 three-bedroom married quarters at Takoradi. The Forward Operating Base at Ezilinbo is also progressing steadily and would be commissioned this year.

There has been an expanding and reorganization of the Navy to meet current security challenges. This expanding drive include the creation of two new commands: Logistics and Riverine Commands, the introduction of the Administrative Branch and the reorganization of the Departments at the Headquarters to include Deputy Chief Staff Officers which has resulted in the increase in staff numbers.

So when Admiral Yakubu in his remarks during this year's annual conference, say the Navy is on an even keel, he means just that. The ship is afloat and sailing smoothly to the desired destination. I urge all personnel of the Navy to continue to support the dream of the CNS to see the Navy shine.

PRESIDENT COMMISSIONS **SHIPS FOR GHANA NAVY**

he President of the Republic and Commander-in-Chief (C-in-C) of the Ghana Armed Forces (GAF), Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo commissioned two Boundary Class Ships for the Ghana Navy at the Western Naval Command (WNC) on Saturday 9 September 2023.

The C-in-C also commissioned two Defender Class Boats, GNS FAIDOO and GNS AMOAMA; a Ghana Navy Landing Craft named "NAVDOCK" 1, and an Oil Spill Response Vessel, MV ESTHER AFUA OCLOO for the Ghana Maritime Author-

Delivering the keynote address, the C-in-C said the commissioning of the ships forms part of Government's efforts in retooling and equipping the GAF to enable them perform their duties diligently. He applauded the Ghana Navy for their efforts in protecting the maritime domain as there have not been any attack on ships in the last two years.

The President extended his appreciation to the United States of America (USA) Government for their benevolence in supporting Ghana's Military Revitalisation Programme through capacity building. He stressed that the

the acquisition of Offshore and Fast Patrol Vessels were still under consideration for acquisition.

The President applauded the Ghana Navy for the efforts made in building NAVDOCK 1, which is Ghana's first indigenous Landing Craft measuring 11.5m in length and designed to carry 30 personnel and 1 ton of cargo. He acknowledged the sacrifices made by the families of the personnel and urged the crew of the commissioned vessels to live up to the billings of the Ghana Navy.

The Minister for Defence, Honourable Dominic Nitiwul noted that, there could not have been development without security thus the importance of a wellequipped Armed Forces cannot be overemphasized hence prioritizing its needs. He commended the American Government for lending enormous support to GAF.

On her part, the US Ambassador to Ghana, Ambassador Virginia Palmer, said Ghana and US' bilateral cooperation ties was significant towards achieving this stride.

She urged the Ghana Navy to put the vessels to good use in order to enhance the safety of Ghana's territorial waters, the Exclusive Economic Zone and the Gulf of Guinea. The Ambassador added

traffickers, and criminals the use of the sea for their illegal activities.

The Chief of the Naval Staff (CNS), Rear Admiral Issah Adam Yakubu expressed gratitude to the C-in-C for his efforts towards equipping the Ghana Navy. He expressed gratitude to the Chief of the Defence Staff, Vice Admiral Seth Amoama for starting an initiative that has seen the Navy manufacture its first Landing Craft.

The CNS was hopeful the initiative will kickstart the manufacturing of boats locally and also enable the Navy to support the Army in amphibious operations. He added that, the Forward Operating Base project under construction in the Jomoro district in the Western region was more than 50% complete.

The project, when completed, will have a Naval Harbour, accommodation for about 10,000 troops, surveillance systems and other ancillary equipment which will make it the single largest defence project in Ghana's history.

Commissioning warrants for the respective ships were handed over to Lt (GN) Evans Blay Emu Nyamekeh Enwuli, Commanding Officer GNS HALF ASSINI and Lt (GN) David Thompson, Commanding Officer GNS AFLAO.

















PRESIDENT LAUNCHES NATIONAL INTEGRATED MARITIME STRATEGY, OPENS IMDEC 23 LS Abdul-Latif Seidu

The President of the Republic and Commander in Chief of the Ghana Armed Forces (GAF), Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo successfully launched the National Integrated Maritime Strategy (NIMS) on Tuesday 29 August 2023 during the 3rd edition of the International Maritime Defence Exhibition and Conference (IMDEC) at Burma Camp, Accra.







The President, in his keynote address said the implementation plan of NIMS seeks to bolster effective collaboration amongst key stakeholders within Ghana's security architecture and international partners for a safe and secure maritime domain.

He stressed that the heightened threat of piracy in the Gulf of Guinea (GoG) calls for littoral West African States to prioritize their maritime domains. He added that the ongoing international discourse on the exploitation of the blue economy has called for countries to safeguard their territorial waters thus adopting measures in keeping our waters safe.

On his part, the Chief of the Naval Staff, Rear Admiral Issah Adam Yakubu said the key takeaway from IMDEC 23 in line with its theme; 'Consolidating the Gains made in the Gulf of Guinea: The Role of Stakeholders and Technology in Sustaining a Safe and Secure Maritime Domain', will be to develop a regional and international framework to particularly deal with the challenges of piracy and other transnational maritime crimes.

The Deputy Minister for Defence, Honourable Kofi Amankwa-Manu in his closing remarks on the second day of the Conference and Exhibition, appealed to Chiefs of Navies to sustain and improve the pace at which they handle the challenges that hinder the collective aspirations of GoG States. He expressed optimism that the outcome of IMDEC 23 will assist in hastening the processes towards achieving the objectives of the Yaoundé Architecture.

The Yaoundé Architecture is an Inter-Regional Coordination Centre responsible for coordination and informationsharing, which connects Regional Maritime Security Centres for Central and West African states.

IMDEC 23 brought together regional and international Chiefs of Navies to help address critical issues bothering on maritime security on the African continent. It also focused on fostering dialogue and collaboration among key stakeholders in sustaining a safe and secure maritime domain.

The Conference and Exhibition saw in attendance several participants from 22 countries including 10 Chiefs of Navies and Heads of Coast Guards, a number of international and local exhibitors and sponsors as well as over 30 speakers.

The C-in-C also used the occasion to commission the new exhibition hall built to accommodate the growing event.

The Chief of the Naval Staff (CNS), Rear Admiral Issah Adam Yakubu has highlighted the significant achievements made by the Navy in the past year saying, the Ghana Navy was on an even keel and making steady headway to its destination of Agenda 2024.

The CNS indicated that the Ghana Navy is committed to working closely with the US Coast Guard to advance their amphibious capabilities in defending the




maritime domain.

he Chief of the Naval Staff (CNS) Rear Admiral Issah Adam Yakubu has assured personnel of the Ghana Navy of his unwavering commitment towards their welfare.

Addressing personnel of the Naval Headquarters at an all-ranks durbar held on Friday 29 December 2023 at the Owusu Ansah Hall, the CNS emphasized that the welfare of personnel remains paramount amidst some challenges.

On capacity building, the CNS said the Specialist Qualification (SQ) courses for Ratings would be accredited to the various Technical Universities in Ghana for appropriate certification. He hinted that Command had signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ho and Takoradi Technical Universities to train and issue certification for Ratings.

Rear Admiral Yakubu indicated that, as part of the ongoing expansion in the Ghana Armed Forces, the Navy has established 2 new Commands; the Riverine and Logistics Commands.

he Director Navy Religious Affairs, Commander David Benedict Quayson, launched four books on Wednesday 1 November 2023 at Burma Hall, Burma Camp, Accra.

The books are The Ghana Armed Forces Spousal Handbook, Marriage in God's Way, Institutional Chaplaincy in Africa and Skills Training Handbook.

In a speech read on behalf of the Chief of the Defence Staff (CDS), Vice Admiral Seth Amoama by the Chief of the Army Staff, Major General Thomas Oppong Peprah, the CDS said the launching of the books was timely as they touch on pertinent issues relating to the Armed Forces and the lives of personnel in the service.

He stressed that, the book, Institutional Chaplaincy in Africa, deeply discusses the subject of military chaplaincy from

an African perspective and is an addendum to many other kinds of literature on chaplaincy that seeks to give some basic understanding of military chaplaincy. The book also give space to the history, and contemporary

realities of institutional chaplaincy for those who are already serving as chaplains and those nursing the desire to become institutional chaplains.

The CDS said the books also shed light on military, religion, and morality in a fastpaced and dynamic world as well as the impact of marriage and spousal responsibility on the well-being of the individual soldier and the Service at large.

His book on Skills Training spells out the potential benefits of skills training to personnel and their spouses during their active service and retired lives.

In the "Ghana Armed Forces Spousal Handbook", the author takes nonmilitary spouses of Service personnel on a journey to come to terms with their roles, responsibilities, and privileges as expected by the Armed Forces and the entire military community.

With the multiplicity of roles come the strenuous demands on the spouses of



Service personnel thus stated that it was important, a manual on the dynamics of the military service and associated challenges faced by spouses exist to help particularly, the non-military spouse, to navigate safely.

The Chairman for the book launch, Very Reverend Professor Joseph Manasseh Yarquah Adusa-Eyison said the church plays a key role in education necessary for the future.

The author in his remarks, thanked Almighty God, the Military High Command and all for gracing the occasion on a successful book launch.

GHANA NAVY FLEXES STRENGTH AT SEA, CONDUCTS EXERCISE SEA LION 2024 LS Abdul-Latif Seidu

The Ghana Navy has flexed its strength at sea with the conduction of a large-scale training exercise codenamed "EXERCISE SEA LION" from Tuesday 19 to Friday 22 March 2024, showcasing their strength and readiness to defend the nation's territorial waters.

he Ocean Navigation Exercise is aimed at testing the endurance and combat readiness of selected Ghana Navy Ships, enhance maritime security and interoperability, train personnel in fleet maneuvers and conduct a joint exercise between the three arms of the Ghana Armed Forces (GAF).

Speaking at a Flagging-Off Ceremony held at the Clinker Jetty of the Tema Main Harbour, Chief of the Defence Staff (CDS), Lieutenant General Thomas Oppong-Peprah applauded the Ghana Navy for the initiative and said that the joint nature of the exercise would help build the interoperability for future operations and contemporary security threats such as piracy and terrorism in the West African sub-region. This, he said, requires a robust, comprehensive, adequately equipped and well trained personnel to deal with such issues.

The CDS symbolically fired a pistol to set sail the selected ships earmarked for the exercise. The ships included Ghana Navy Ship GNS ANKOBRA commanded by Lt Cdr Mohammed, GNS VOLTA also commanded Lt Cdr Samuel Sabbah Sarbah and United States Navy Ship



(USNS) Hershel Woody Williams.

One of the highlights of the exercise was the Ghana Navy's journey to the equator at Zero Degrees Latitude and Zero Degrees Longitude, where they sailed to participate in the century-old tradition of crossing the equator. This milestone was celebrated with a ceremony known as "Crossing the Line ceremony", where first time participants and new sailors were initiated into the ancient maritime tradition by King Neptune.

The Exercise Sea Lion 2024 was climaxed with a remarkable culmination of major military amphibious exercises, which involved a joint simulation exercise by personnel drawn from the Army Special Operations Brigade, Ghana Navy Special Boat Squadron and Fighter Squadron of the Ghana Air Force.

Additionally, it was used to rehearse the GACL Emergency Operations Centre and validate the draft Harmonised Standard Operations Procedure of Maritime Operating Centres in collaboration with the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime.


The event served as a period of reflection on the successes chalked during the year and also create avenue for togetherness amongst all and sundry.

he MoU further seeks to enhance collaborations in the area of capacity building and afford training opportunities between the two institutions.

The MoU was formalized with exchange of signatories between the Chief of the Naval Staff (CNS), Rear Admiral Issah Adam Yakubu and the General Manager Fly Zipline Ghana Limited, Mr Mawuli Atiemo at a brief ceremony held at the Naval Headquarters, Burma Camp, Accra on Wednesday 8 November 2023.

Rear Admiral Issah Adam Yakubu said the primary role of the Navy is to provide sea defence and maritime support, thus Fly Zipline Ghana's request for help to recover lost drones was timely and within the capabilities of the Navy.

He stressed that plans were underway, to form the Ghana Navy Drone Squadron which will be responsible for operating its drones to assist in search and rescue operations. He said with the

establishment of the drone squadron, recovery of drones which may be ditched particularly in riverine bodies will be easier to retrieve.

The CNS maintained that it was important to be technologically advanced in order to have access to web-based tracking system and with the collaboration onboard, analysis on info-graphics will become easier having to tap on Zipline Ghana's expertise and capacity.

Meanwhile, Mr Mawuli Atiemo was hopeful that with the signing of the MoU, the two institutions will have an enhanced partnership in sharing ideas which will be beneficial to the country at large.

He added that Fly Zipline Ghana is on a mission to develop the largest supply chain company, mentioning that the company currently runs as the largest autonomous delivery of drones across the world from its base in Ghana. The Company also delivers medical vaccines as well as emergency products like anti-snakes and rabies as well as blood.

The Ghana Navy honoured its fallen heroes during the 10th commemorative ceremony held at the Ceremonial Jetty of the Western Naval Command (WNC), Sekondi-Takoradi on Thursday 14 September 2023.

he memorial parade is held annually to mark the bombing of Ghana Navy Ship (GNS) YOGAGA 33 years ago during the Liberia civil war, which claimed the lives of some Officers and Ratings. Based on this, the Military High Command has granted the Ghana Navy to set aside 14 September to honour these fallen heroes.

Delivering a speech on behalf of the Chief of the Naval Staff (CNS), Rear Admiral Issah Adam Yakubu, the Flag Officer Commanding (FOC) Western Naval Command, Commodore Emmanuel Ayesu Kwafo noted that, such events provided the opportunity to solemnly reflect on the sacrifices made by the fallen heroes in the interest of peace and freedom. He stressed that freedom was sometimes obtained at a cost and had given the Navy a reason to assemble to honour the heroes who served and paid the ultimate price including losing their lives in their efforts to restore peace in Liberia.

He noted that, the survivors of the 14 September 1990 incident deserved to be honoured, since they had to carry the burden of losing a ship with their comrades onboard. He used the opportunity to console the families of the fallen heroes and asked for God's guidance in their lives.

The FOC ended by saying that, the

greatest sacrifice was to protect the freedom of others at the expense of their own lives and asked Officers and Ratings to continue to serve and inspire present and future generations.

The Guest of Honour, the Western Regional Minister, Hon Dr Kwabena Okyere Darko-Mensah expressed his gratitude to the Navy for the invitation. He said that, the period reminded everyone of their dearly departed Officers and Ratings who left their families and loved ones and sailed to Liberia in the pursuit of peace and security which to him was the quintessential of heroism.

The Minister emphasised that, till eternity, they must remember and honour the memories of the gallant Officers and Ratings to inspire them to keep faith with the values of selflessness, loyalty and integrity.

Hon Okyere Darko-Mensah pledged the government's continued support for uniform personnel in the area of logistics and equipment necessary for the



discharge of their duties to the state. He asked God to grant the souls of the departed heroes eternal rest.



He noted that most countries rely on the services of their national shipping industry to cart goods instead of foreign shipping industries hence the need to intensify teaching and training at the industry levels in order to revive the shipping industry.

He urged the Merchant Navy to liaise with key stakeholders in the transport sector to facilitate the drive towards the achievement of sea transport goals. He also assured them of continuous security support since the Ghana Navy

was already in the business of providing security services to oil companies from Tema to Takoradi.

Captain Onassis revealed that the Association is working tirelessly on building a strong partnership with Ghana Navy to identify common grounds to be able to work together in the maritime domain as advisors and consultants.

Engineer Cadet Benedict Eyisah of the Regional Maritime University stated that they are conducting a Feasibility Study for a Tema to Takoradi sea transport in harnessing Ghana's water bodies.
